**Digital ticket wallets** / Digital tickets are new this season! Visit wallet.waltonartscenter.org and log in to view your tickets. Digital tickets feature a rotating QR code for security purposes. This code will be scanned from your smartphone for entry to the show. You can choose to have your tickets held at Will Call if you don't have a smartphone. Arrive early to make sure you get to your seats in plenty of time!

Inclement weather policy / It is rare for a performance at Walton Arts Center to be canceled due to inclement weather, but in the case that a show is canceled, information will be posted on our website, social media and phone system, and every effort will be made to contact all affected ticket holders. If the performance is still scheduled but inclement weather makes it impossible for you to attend, please contact the box office at 479.443.5600. Our ticket representatives will help you consider all options. Due to contracts with performers and production companies, options for day-of-show exchanges vary. All ticket donations or exchanges must be completed at least two hours before the performance.




