Artist Statement

As a ceramic artist, I explore the full spectrum of human emotion—grief, joy, and everything in between—through functional pottery. My work serves not only as vessels for daily use but also as vessels for expression, inviting dialogue and storytelling through the union of form, function, and narrative.

Rooted in traditional ceramic techniques, yet shaped by a contemporary lens, each piece I create is both intentional and intuitive. I view the surface of every form as a blank canvas—ready to be carved, painted, and brought to life with emotion and meaning. Through craftsmanship and care, I aim to celebrate the tactile beauty of clay and the timeless power of personal connection.
