Bio

Ekaterina Kouznetsova was born in the Siberian mountains of the Altai region of Kazakhstan near the end of the Soviet Union. For more than two decades, she lived much of her childhood into her early twenties in Argentina before moving to the United States. Having studied linguistics and translation at a university in Buenos Aires, an international move to the prolific art scene of the United States changed her direction. Ekaterina decided to return to university to pursue another degree related to this passion and is currently a Fine Arts student at the NorthWest Arkansas Community College in Bentonville. Her forte is in the fine details she brings to life with oils, playing with light and a carefully selected palette of colors. Her art has been shaped by the myriad landscapes and cityscapes around the globe. While many different cultures, peoples, and architecture always stir Ekaterina's soul, she also finds a certain peace in coming back to her roots of her far away homelands.

Ekaterina's works can be found at Red Door Gallery in North Little Rock and Gallery 26 in Little Rock. Her most recent accolades include Best in Show in the NWACC Spring of 2023 Student Exhibition and participation in the 2023 Small Works On Paper organized by the Arkansas Art Council.
