Bio

Briseida Ochoa's "Brioch" (b. El Paso, TX) work includes photography, painting, mixed media and printmaking. By applying abstraction, she creates intense personal moments created by means of rules and omissions, acceptance and refusal, luring in the viewer. The results are deconstructed to the extent that meaning is shifted and possible interpretation becomes multifaceted. Her work demonstrates how life extends beyond its own subjective limits and often tells a story about the effects of cultural interaction. It challenges the binaries we continually reconstruct between self and the other. She currently lives and works in Bentonville, AR.

Artist Statement

Born near the border of El Paso, TX and Juárez, Chihuahua, Ochoa states, "Oftentimes finding myself immensely inspired by my community's social issues and surroundings, I seek a creative way to portray them and contribute to a possible solution while creating public awareness." This includes art projects, residencies, and organizing in El Paso and Northwest Arkansas. The artist is currently working on several projects that investigate the phases of alternative photography techniques with a fusion of dance, installation, and video. Her work demonstrates how life extends beyond its own subjective limits and often tells a story about the effects of cultural interaction, challenging binaries we continually reconstruct between self and the other.
